

The 2024 UN debate on 'International Cooperation on Peaceful Uses' Clarifying the role and purpose of export controls

Wednesday, 9 October 2024, 13:15–14:30 United Nations Conference Room 8

The UN General Assembly First Committee will address international cooperation on peaceful uses during its 79th session in the context of re-tabling a related draft resolution. This side event will support these discussions by providing space for a multidimensional exchange of views about the multilateral export control regimes and domestic export controls. This will include a discussion of the contribution these regimes and controls make to international peace and security; their role in facilitating or hampering transfers of dual-use items and other sensitive technologies, and scientific exchanges for peaceful uses; and the benefits and risks associated with proposed changes to how they operate. Researchers and developing states will present their perspectives on the topic.
